

*Service of Thanksgiving and Celebration following the
ending of Covid restrictions - Sunday, 25th July
St James the Apostle*

With the Government announcing the ending of lockdown restrictions on 19th July, we plan to hold our delayed service of Thanksgiving and Celebration on Sunday, 25th July (St James the Apostle). See next week's Newsletter for full information but initial plans include:

- using the high altar for the celebration
- communion will be administered at the high altar and also in St David's Chapel
- mask wearing will be optional
- some social distancing should be maintained (please do not sit directly behind a person in the pew in front of you)
- full choir and congregational singing
- expressions of thanks to everyone who has helped keep services running online and in church during the pandemic
- refreshments after the service

We are awaiting guidance on whether it will be permissible to offer the bread and wine separately—but pre-intincted wafers will be available for anyone who has reservations about receiving the chalice (dipping wafers into the wine will not be permitted).

Eucharistic ministers will be able to resume their duties, as will our Servers, Acolytes and Welcomers and rotas will be updated and issued shortly.

Churchyard Clear-Up

The next session on 17th July will concentrate on tidying the Deakin Memorial Garden and the area around the wooden shed on the north side of St Mary's.
